


ABOUT THIS STORYBOARD

WHAT IS THE TOWNS FUND?

The Towns Fund is an opportunity for Skegness to respond to local challenges with transformational projects funded by the UK government. These projects will become catalysts to drive longterm economic productivity and growth for our town through three key project types: regeneration, skills and enterprise and connectivity.



With 30,000 residents, Skegness, Ingoldmells and Chapel St Leonards have some key challenges to transport, digital connectivity, health, education, skills and jobs. To overcome these challenges we need to unlock opportunities that will attract people to our beautiful coast and town to live, work and visit here to stimulate the local economy.

AN ENTERPRISING



EMERGING IDEAS

As we continue to engage with the local community, public and private stakeholders we are developing project ideas for the Towns Fund. This list identifies some of the key projects outlined to date.

Hardy's Investment

Multi-user pathway enabling a new walking/ cycling route which connects the visitor attraction to Chapel St Leonards and the Coastal Path.

Skegness Gateway

Development site with plans for a Further Education Campus with leisure facilities, park and ride for the town and new homes.

Links to the existing business park and enhancement plans.

Town Centre Developments

New Police Training facility linked to the existing Station and redevelopment of the Court buildings.

Train Station improvements.

A focus on Lumley Road with public realm, traffic management and primary site developments.

Projects are emerging with a focus on young people with the YMCA and an art trail with Hildreds.

Foreshore Masterplan

Redevelopment of the foreshore with the pedestrianisation of the Esplanade, reviving the boating lakes and improving the designated Historic Parks and Gardens.

Exploring the walking, cycling and cultural and environmental opportunities to link Skegness with the Lincolnshire Coast.

TRANSFORMATIONAL **PROJECTS**

FORESHORE DEVELOPMENT

Regenerating the Skegness foreshore to improve walking and cycling paths, planting and seating to create a more welcoming environment and encouraging greater use of the foreshore.

- · Creating a natural route to connect the town centre and coastline making it easier to walk and cycle
- · New outdoor areas for events, activities and entertainment to extend opening hours and increase footfall
- · Reinstating the cycle path and improving signage, colour scheme and landscaping
- · Improved use of designated Historic Parks & Gardens



A state-of-the-art campus providing further education and higher education close to home for students living in Skegness and nearby towns and villages, to bridge the skills gap.

- Developing further and higher education in Skegness
- Building a skilled workforce and a culture of enterprise
- · Promoting partnerships and collaborations with technology institutes and local industries
- · Amplifying the local ambitions and aspirations

Development of a suite of high quality, low density eco-chalets, extending and diversifying the visitor season with new and repeat visitors.

- · Promoting and maximising the attraction of the natural coast and countryside
- · Increased visitor footfall, interest, and expenditure within the local economy
- · Better quality accommodation to attract higher local spend
- Environmental improvements and flood risk mitigation design

FUTURE SKEGNESS

As a community of Skegness we will be moving forward together towards a diverse and inclusive success story. We will be growing and thriving as a community thanks to our bold and ambitious plans to implement regenerative systems to our environment, community and economy.
