Skegness Railway Station



Work has now begun on phase 1 of the transformational redevelopment at Skegness Railway Station.

Phase 1 works will bring the unused building at the front of the station back into use after many years. The building will be transformed into new customer areas and new retail units. Further phases of works will continue throughout 2024.



The works will be carried out by the principal contractor Taziker Ltd and managed by EMR. Throughout the duration of the works, the station will be open as normal to any customers wishing to travel to / from Skegness railway station.

£3.3 million is being invested at Skegness railway station, funded by the Towns Fund through Connected Coast, Network Rail and East Midlands Railway (EMR).

The phase one works that are now starting are the first step towards achieving the ambitions for the railway station which will ultimately see more footfall and use in the years to come.

Skegness Town Centre Transformation

Work has also begun on the Town Centre Transformation in Skegness.

This winter, the first projects will be delivered on Lumley Road. Heritage Lincolnshire has been working with local businesses and architects to gain planning permission for seven reinstated shopfronts; four have their permissions and are now moving onsite.

At Tower Gardens, work to restore the historic pleasure garden to its former glory through a scheme of hard landscaping and planting is set to start on site in the coming weeks. The plans for the park will also see work to improve accessibility.

The Town Centre Transformation works are set to significantly enhance Skegness, restoring building shopfronts, rejuvenating Tower Gardens, creating better public realm and street scenes, and ultimately, revitalising the town.

National Trust Sandilands

In December, East Lindsey District Council granted planning permission to National Trust Sandilands' plans to create a wetland nature reserve and multi-purpose visitor hub at Sandilands, with work set to begin in 2024.

The planning approval is a major step forward in creating a haven for nature on the Lincolnshire Coast. The carbon-neutral visitor welcome building at the northern tip of the reserve will be designed to complement the nature reserve and surrounding area. This building will include a café and a community space. There will also be nearby changing place facilities suitable for children and adults with accessibility needs

The plans also include forming wetland wildlife habitats with open water, islands, reedbeds and ponds, complete with walkways and boardwalks.

There will be swathes of grasslands and plenty of sand-dunes to encourage local wildlife and migratory birds to settle, rest and populate. Work on the project is expected to be completed by the end of 2025.

Levelling Up - Alford Windmill tour The trustees of Alford Windmill recently took part in a familiarisation visit as part of the work to restore the Grade I listed windmill as a prominent landmark and visitor attraction.

During the visit, the trustees spent time at Denver Windmill a successfully restored mill in Downham Market, Norfolk, speaking to the owner and operator of the mill and visiting its associated businesses, bar, and holiday lets. The tour moved onto Tim Whiting's Suffolk Millwrights workshop. Tim is one of the last remaining traditional millwrights in the UK and he and his small team specialise in the restoration, repair, and maintenance of the country's remaining windmills.

Alford Windmill is benefiting from £1.1M in Levelling Up funding which will see the mill restored and reopened as a major attraction, including a

new visitor experience, café, and shop.

The windmill is one of three projects to benefit from major capital investment from East Lindsey District Council's Lincolnshire Wolds Culture and Heritage programme. The programme includes ambitious regeneration schemes at Alford Windmill, Alford Manor House, and Spilsby Sessions House. The three historic sites are set to benefit from a total of £8 million in Levelling Up funding from the Government.

UK Shared Prosperity Fund

Local businesses and skills providers in the South and East Lincolnshire sub-region can now apply for grants that will support the growth of jobs and higher pay in our area. The



available grants, through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF), will have an emphasis on two themes - digital and employment skills, and local business skills needs.

The minimum grant award for theme one is £25,000, with no maximum level and the minimum grant for theme two is £20,000 with a maximum of £150,000.

The announcement of the new grants comes after further UK Shared Prosperity and Rural Prosperity Funds (UKSPF/REPF) were awarded in East Lindsey. This includes:

• Magna Vitae - International Cultural Exchange Programme - To develop and deliver an International Cultural Exchange Programme in partnership with the International People's College (IPC), Denmark and the British Embassy in Copenhagen.



• National Trust Sandilands - Sandilands Connects - The Sandilands Connects project complements the Towns Fund investment and will specifically focus on expanding the space available to the public and accessibility on the Sandilands site. It will be free at the point of access to all residents of East Lindsey (no requirement for a National Trust membership).

New Board Member

We've been pleased to welcome a new member to the Connected Coast board. Paul McCooey is a Director at Duncan & Toplis and has led the Skegness office since 2013. New Culture Board

The South & East Lincolnshire Councils Partnership has held the first meeting of a new, culture board which will help to create a more vibrant and dynamic arts, cultural and heritage offer for residents and visitors.

One of the key roles of the board will be to lead on the Partnership's ambitious three-year National Portfolio Organisation programme, a £2million Arts Council England funded programme to support art, culture, heritage and creativity across the whole of the Partnership area. All board members also have the responsibility to champion the Boston and East Lindsey Cultural Framework, as well as supporting its future development and expansion into South Holland, which is now under commission.

It was recently announced by the Government that Skegness will receive a further £20M in funding through the Long Term Plan for Towns. Quebec Road, Mablethorpe

Mablethorpe is set to see Quebec Road improved in the New Year. The works, which are separate to our Towns Fund work and are being delivered by Lincolnshire County Council, will be carried out on Quebec Road between Golf Road and North End and will begin on Tuesday, 2nd January with a scheduled end date of Wednesday, 7th February subject to suitable weather or unforeseen circumstances. There will be a 24-hour road closure in place throughout the works programme with a diversion route via North End, Kent Avenue, Theddlethorpe Road, Alford Road, Golf Road and vice versa.

A year of progress



Over the last twelve months, we have seen good progress across all of our projects. In Mablethorpe, the Campus for Future Living and the Station Leisure and Learning Centre got under way and these developments are taking shape rapidly. We also got on site at the Colonnade, and in Skegness, improvements have started at the railway station.

The year also saw more investment announced for our

area, with £8M Levelling Up awarded to East Lindsey, and £5M Cultural Development Funding for Skegness. More recently, the town was also confirmed as a recipient of a further £20M through the Long Term Plan for Towns.

We can look forward to even more progress in 2024 when work will begin on the new Skegness Learning Campus – an economic game changer for the area. We will also see the start of improvements at the Embassy Theatre, and Skegness Pier. It is set to be another exciting year for our connected coast, bringing many benefits for people who live and visit here.
