

This summer has seen progress being made on a number of our projects. The new pool at the Leisure and Learning Hub in Mablethorpe has undergone its 'test fill' and I was pleased to see how the build at the Campus for Future Living is moving forward. It's also great to see that work is now getting underway on the Colonnade with the transformation of this much-loved site set to be completed next year. The Colonnade

Work on the new Sutton on Sea Colonnade development got underway on 4th September with activity on site including the erection of fencing, arrival of cabins, relocation of some seating and the necessary removal for relocation of play equipment before full construction starts.

There will be some disruption and impact to access during the works, but the paddling pool will remain open for the rest of the season, and the public toilets will be available throughout the project.

The redevelopment of the Colonnade and Pleasure Gardens offers a unique opportunity to bring new facilities and opportunities to Sutton on Sea, and this important and exciting project is a priority for us.

The work beginning on the ground will deliver the improvements that will create a new future for the Colonnade and Pleasure Gardens, building on its heritage.





Leisure and Learning Hub

August saw an important milestone for the Leisure and Learning Hub at Mablethorpe as the new public swimming pool was filled with water to test it.

Contractors ISG officially carried out the pool fill test at a special event. When completed, the swimming pool will be part of the new Station Leisure and Learning Centre that is under construction.



Work is running to schedule with the facility due to be completed in 2024.

This modern facility is set to play a crucial role in supporting local people's physical and mental wellbeing, bringing improved and new opportunities for leisure and learning to Mablethorpe. The hub is set to add to Mablethorpe's overall offer and will provide new reasons for people to spend time in the town centre.





Campus for Future Living

Development of the Campus for Future Living is making great progress as the building takes shape in Mablethorpe.

A site visit this summer highlighted how the build is moving forward, with the steel frames and upper floor of the main building now in place.

Work started in February and contractors Lindum are scheduled to handover the Stanley Avenue site back to the Council in March 2024.

In September, people supported by Linkage in Mablethorpe were given a tour of the Campus for Future Living construction site to see the work up close.

Linkage is a charity which supports people with learning disabilities across Lincolnshire by delivering specialist education, care, day services, employability support and much more.



All of the adults who took part in the visit attend Linkage Choices or live at Linkage houses in Mablethorpe. After an introduction at the Lindum site cabin, the group were then shown around the construction site and saw machinery used for the build.

UK Shared Prosperity Funding

The South & East Lincolnshire Councils Partnership has announced that 14 organisations, community groups, initiatives and events across the area have been awarded more than £1.2million from the third round of funding from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund and Rural Prosperity Fund. Let's Move East Lindsey is one of the beneficiaries in East Lindsey. This is a pilot programme focusing on signposting and communicating more than 150 opportunities for sport and physical activity via a digital platform to residents across East Lindsey, enabling them to live healthier and more active lives.

Coastal Special Interest Group visit

This month South & East Lincolnshire Councils Partnership hosted a visit from the Local



Government Association Coastal Special Interest Group, exploring Boston and East Lindsey to find out more about some of the transformational work and initiatives currently taking place in Lincolnshire

During the visit, the group spent time learning more about the area's major capital projects, including the Colonnade, the Campus for Future Living and the Embassy Theatre. The group also walked around the Skegness Foreshore Development.
