# **Long Term Plan for Towns**



Thank you so much to everyone who took part in our consultation in the summer around the Long Term Plan for Towns funding for Skegness. 161 people had their say in our survey, and we also heard thoughts, ideas, and suggestions at events, and via our feedback boards in town.

We found out that overwhelmingly people feel that the best thing about Skegness is its beach and coastline. There is, however, appetite for

significant improvements that could create a better town centre experience for everyone - in the survey, 68% of respondents said they would most like to see improved public spaces. You can read the full report <u>here</u>

Now, we're working on a long-term plan for Skegness. Our original deadline set by the government for submission was 1<sup>st</sup> August but this has now been moved and we are awaiting direction on a new timescale. # **News from Mablethorpe**

## **Station Leisure and Learning**

The new Station Leisure and Learning Centre is now open. This is the first Town Deal project completed in Mablethorpe and has benefited from £7.5M Towns Fund investment. The new modern centre offers a four-lane swimming pool, as well as state-of-the-art fitness equipment, community space, social workspace, and more. The new centre, which is operated by Magna Vitae, will play a crucial role in supporting the wellbeing of local people. Find out more <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>

## The Campus for Future Living



In more good news for Mablethorpe, Acis Group has been announced as the operator of the Campus for Future Living in Mablethorpe. The campus, which has seen £8.6M Towns Fund investment, will be brought to life by the partnership between East Lindsey District Council and Acis. Plans for the campus include a range of activities, networking space and room hire, all the aim of making a difference in the community. A number of events

#### **Sandilands**



Work is now underway to create a 25-hectare (62 acre) wetland nature reserve at Sandilands, which will include open water, islands, reedbeds and ponds to encourage more wildlife and migratory birds to return to the area. The site, cared for by the National Trust, will also see the development of a new visitor hub which will offer a base to explore Sandilands. The new hub is being supported by £2M in Towns Fund investment. Find out more here

#### Colonnade

Work is progressing well on the former Colonnade and Pleasure Gardens redevelopment. Residents have recently been invited to share their thoughts on a new name for the new facility via an online web poll, which closes at the end of September 24. The redeveloped site will offer a state-of-the-art pavilion, with lettable spaces for a café and restaurant, a Changing Places toilet and cultural exhibition space. New beach huts will also be





included, as well as improvements to the landscaping to create further areas and space for pop-up cultural events and markets. A new marketing brochure has been published for the project which can be found <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>

# News from Skegness Cultural Skegness

Work on Cultural Skegness which will see the redesign and redevelopment of the historic Embassy Theatre in Skegness has begun. Planning permission for the project was granted on 5<sup>th</sup> September, with work taking place to include significant upgrades to seating within the auditorium, an extended storage area for staging



and equipment, and the creation of a new feature entrance and multi-purpose space to the rear of the building. A new external seating area will be introduced, and there will be upgrades to existing changing rooms, lift and toilet areas throughout. #### **Town Centre Transformation**

Alisons department store, one of Skegness' best known shops, has been transformed after extensive work was carried out to refurbish the building. Located on Lumley Road, Alisons has undergone a sympathetic revamp that has seen its historic features restored. This includes bringing back into use previously blocked timber windows on the upper floor, and reintroducing traditional shopfronts. Further improvements are also planned for after the end of the season, including the fitting of new entrances, and the installation of traditional retractable canopies. The improvements have been made possible thanks to investment from the business owner and a substantial grant though the Town Centre Transformation project. ### **Skegness Learning Campus**

Work is progressing well on the new Skegness Learning Campus, with the steel framework now in place. Plans are also moving forward for the interior design. The building is set to open its doors to learners in September 2025.



# Other investment and projects

### **Culture and Heritage Programme**

East Lindsey's culture and heritage programme, made possible by government funding, is moving forward with scaffolding installed and bat surveys taking place at Spilsby Sessions House and its outbuildings in August.

#### **UK Shared Prosperity Funding**

A plaque has been unveiled to celebrate the progress of works at the Lincolnshire Coast Light Railway in Skegness which have been funded by the UK Shared Prosperity Fund.
