News from Skegness

In May, the **Connected Coast Board** had the chance to see the impact of Towns Fund investment at the Embassy Theatre where extensive renovation works have taken place. We identified the refurbishment of this much-loved theatre as a priority for funding so that we could support a better arts and culture offer in the town for local people and visitors alike. The construction works at **Skegness Railway Station** began again at the end of June and are expected to carry on until early August. ProGen Services are the main contractor for this phase which will enable the newly refurbished Red Star waiting room to open.

Construction of the new Travelodge at the **Foreshore** is now complete and will be welcoming guests to enjoy Skegness very soon. The Board's support for the foreshore is about making sure that the potential of this area is realised for the benefit of local residents, visitors to the town, and the local economy.





News from Mablethorpe

The new **Seaview Colonnade** is now open and will be offering a packed schedule of different activities, workshops and classes for all ages and interests to enjoy this summer. From Tuesday 29 July until Friday 5 September sessions will take place five days a week between Tuesdays and Saturdays throughout the peak holiday period for families and visitors. The activities, which include a combination of walk-ins, new sessions from existing local groups and special workshops, cover a variety of



interests including yoga, dance, theatre, puppetry, DJing and crafts. Find out more here


In addition, the University of Lincoln officially launched the Lincoln Institute for Rural and Coastal Health (LIRCH)—the UK's first dedicated research institute focused on tackling health inequalities in rural and coastal communities at the **Campus for Future Living** on 18th July. Launching the Institute at the Campus for Future Living underlines its commitment to research that is not only nationally significant but locally grounded. Speakers on the day were Professor Mark Gussy, Director of LIRCH, and Claire Woodward, Director of Community Investment at ACIS Group. The event was also supported by special guest Professor Chris Whitty, Chief Medical Officer for England, who delivered a speech via live video before answering questions from the launch guests. 
