Jaydon, who studies plumbing, was the first student to step through the doors and said:


"This is a spectacular new campus for [us] to learn in! I'm excited to learn in the new workshop. It's nice to see how the college has turned out."

Travelodge now open

The new leisure complex providing a new hotel, drive thru restaurant and EV charging facilities at the **Skegness**

Foreshore is now finished and open to guests. The Connected Coast Board has supported this project via a Town Deal grant to make this site suitable for development so that this once empty part of the Foreshore can

be put to good use for the benefit of local residents, visitors to the town, and the local economy.

Skegness Interchange

The waiting room at Skegness Interchange is being temporarily opened during half term from Saturday 25th October until Saturday 1st November. It will reopen permanently once the essential final works are completed to the room, ready to welcome passengers in.



Skegness Neighbourhood Board

Skegness Neighbourhood Board has been set up to oversee the multi-million pound Pride in Place (formerly Plan for Neighbourhoods) funding and plan for Skegness. This summer, the Board carried out consultation to find out people's views and ideas to shape the funding. This included in an online survey, interview sessions in the town centre, a freepost feedback postcard, feedback boards in locations across the town, and a children's competition. Plus, 306 under 25s took part in a survey just for young people.

The image on the right shows what people said in the consultation.

Overall, around 1,100 separate pieces of feedback have been collected since 2024, and the engagement is carrying on with a survey taking place asking for

thoughts on community services, health and wellbeing, and heritage. You can have your say <u>here</u> and community groups, charities, and organisations are also invited to submit expressions of interest for project ideas by 28th October. More details can be found <u>here</u>

News from Mablethorpe

Mablethorpe has been awarded £20 million of investment over the next decade through the government's **Pride in Place programme**.

This funding, which was also previously announced for Skegness, puts local people at the heart of decision-making, giving residents a direct say in how their town grows and develops over the coming years.

Town Centre Transformation in both towns

The **Town Centre Transformation** projects in Skegness and Mablethorpe are coming to an end and there will be further updates about the individual projects. In Skegness projects have transformed shops from Alisons near the train station to the Clock Tower. In Mablethorpe a significant project with balconies being added to the High Street that have enabled Empire Amusements, the Coffee Lounge and the Gift Shop to create great new outdoor space in the heart of the town.

Lincolnshire Wolds Culture and Heritage Programme

The steel frame has arrived on site for the new function room at **Alford Manor House.**

Once the framework has been erected, the team will be able to begin laying bricks, completing the roofing.

During the construction of the new function room, the Manor House remains open for visitors.







Meanwhile, essential roofing works have begun at **Spilsby Sessions House.**These repairs will help weatherproof the building into winter to regulate temperatures throughout the building and stop further damage.
